This NVIT guide will illustrate several common types of citations using the APA style format. It is strongly recommended that you consult with the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Seventh Edition (APA Publication Manual)* for complete information. Chapter 8, 9 and 10 are specifically helpful for guidance on In-text citation, parenthetical references and preparation of the reference list. The *APA Publication Manual* (BF76.7 P83 2020) is available in the NVIT library. Although the *APA Publication manual dictates that the Reference List* should be double-spaced, following examples are single-spaced to preserve space.

REFERENCE CITATIONS IN TEXT

Insert the surname of the author and the year of publication in the text at the appropriate point.

One author:

In one developmental study (Smith, 1990), children learned

Two authors:

Cite both names every time: Jones and Smith (1989) indicate... In one developmental study (Jones & Smith, 1989), children....

Multiple authors:

1st citation: Shortened right from the first citation

(Taylor, Smith, Park, 2018)

First authors last name and "et al.", Ex. (Taylor et al., 2018)

Basic Book Entry:

Author, A. A. (Year of publication), Title of work: Capital letter also for subtitle. Publisher Name.

Single Author:

Nabigon, H. (2006). The hollow tree: Fighting addiction with traditional native healing. McGill.

Two or More Authors:

Utley, R. M., & Washburn, W. E. (2002). Indian wars. First Mariner Books.

Basic Periodical Entry (Journal Article)

Author, A. A., Author, B. B., & Author, C. C. (Year). Title of article. *Title of Periodical, volume number* (issue number), pages.

Findlay, I. M., & Weir, W. I. (2011). Accounting and aboriginal peoples: From the bottom line to lines of relation. *Journal of Aboriginal Economic Development*, 7(2), 55-69.

Author, A. A., Author, B. B., & Author, C. C. (Year). Title of article. Title of Periodical, volume number(issue number), pages. https://doi.org/xxxx
